The Year In Review


2015 was a very full year for MEPO and the House of Flowers. After a traumatic robbery at the House in April, by July everything had stabilized and now all is well. We are now entering our 14th year of operation, and the program just keeps getting better and better.

Razia Is Back as a Teacher! After completing her two years at university, we hired Razia back at HoF! She is the perfect teacher, having grown up in the Montessori environment. She also teaches the children art, something she was always so good at. Everyone at the House is happy to have her back.

Moving Again In August, the staff moved the children to a new house for lower rent. This new house is bigger, has better facilities, and is in a more developed part of town. Unfortunately, the security situation has been deteriorating. A recent bomb attack was only 500 yards from the House, and shattered their windows. But everyone is ok, and the staff continues to protect the children as much as they can.

The Children There are currently 30 children living in the House. In December they completed their exams, with quite high marks. The teachers express their gratitude for being able to use Montessori techniques to teach the children, since it WORKS!

Where are they now? The teachers recently completed a set of records of the 120 HoF children over the years. This list has been posted to the website, and gives brief information about their lives.



MEPO in Nepal This summer, MEPO raised money to help with the earthquake recovery in Nepal. In 2 months, MEPO staff saw 500 patients in health camps, helped fund a toilet-rebuilding project, gave cash and food to displaced villagers, and more. The Nepal report is on our website.
